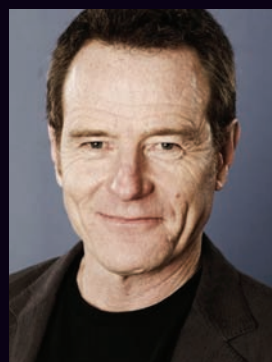
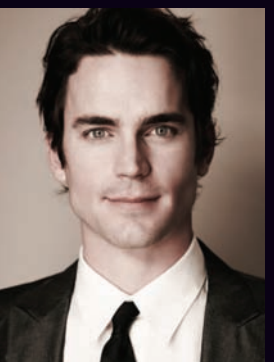

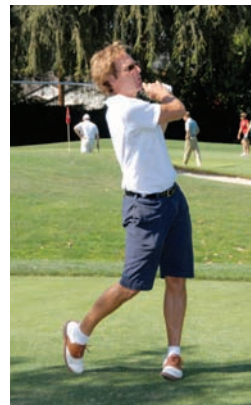
GET INVOLVED

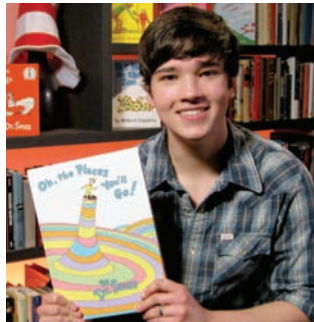
CASTING ACCESS PROJECT: Brings quality cold-reading workshops with established professionals at no cost to SAG members in Los Angeles and New York City.

CATASTROPHIC HEALTH FUND: Provides health insurance grants to eligible Guild members who suffer from a catastrophic illness or injury and cannot afford the Guild's self-pay program.

CHILDREN'S LITERACY INITIATIVE: Inspires the love of reading and writing through innovative educational programs. *BookPALS* (Performing Artists for Literacy in Schools) engages performers in volunteering their time and talent to read aloud to elementary school students at Title 1



schools, museums, hospitals and homeless shelters. *Storyline Online* features well-known actors reading quality children's literature online. *PencilPALS* encourages children to share their thoughts and experiences through correspondence

with *BookPALS* volunteers. *We the Children* gives students the opportunity to write and illustrate their family histories, each immortalized as a leather-bound book, a keepsake as unique and important as each participating child.

CONVERSATIONS: Invites recognizable working actors to talk about their careers and share their experiences in the industry with an audience of actors. Many of these events are shared in real time with an online audience through the Foundation's Live Stream technology as well as filmed for our archives.



DON LAFONTAINE VOICE-OVER LAB: Serves the



voice-over community with a groundbreaking technical, educational and creative facility while paying tribute to one of the field's most talented, successful and admired leaders. Located in Los Angeles, the Lab, which includes two recording booths and classroom space, is home to workshops, seminars and demonstrations.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE: Provides financial assistance to eligible SAG members for basic necessities of life such as rent, medical expenses and utility payments in times of crisis.

JOHN L. DALES SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Honors the Guild's longtime Executive Secretary by giving qualified Guild members and their children scholarships to accredited institutions.

LIFERAFT: Explores the business of acting through career-enhancing seminars led by established industry guests. For the benefit of actors everywhere, many LifeRaft events are Live Streamed from audience venues in Los Angeles and New York.



SELF-PAY ASSISTANCE: Provides short-term grants to eligible SAG members who have lost their earned eligibility through SAG Pension & Health and wish to continue their health insurance coverage through C.O.B.R.A.

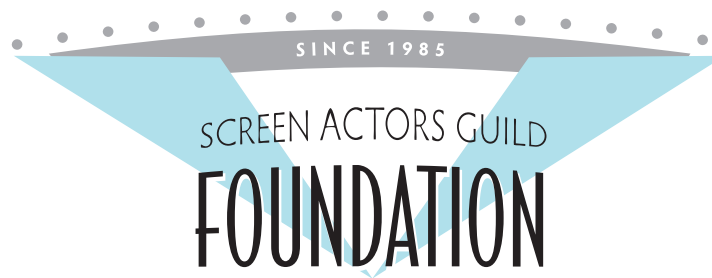
